I do not propose to refer to any of the cases of natives now at Rottrest and sentenced by the Supreme Court or by any Court of Quarter Sessions. These cases will no doubt be separately considered by His Excellency as the occasion may arise.

With regard to the natives now under sentences inflicted by courts of summary jurisdiction, it appears to me that it would be desirable to give them the benefit of the Act passed last session, and treat them as if they had been convicted under the Act. The Act expresses the present views of the Legislative Council, and although there may be cases in which if the Act had been in force at the time of conviction the Magistrate or Justice might have committed the prisoners for trial in order to obtain if possible a more severe punishment than the ~~new~~ Act

penalty; it would be difficult  
if not impossible now to  
make any distinction between  
the various cases.

I would however suggest that  
convictions by Resident Mag-  
istrates sitting alone should  
be treated as if they had  
sat under the new Act  
with another justice, and  
had had power to inflict  
a punishment not exceeding  
two years.

Generally therefore I would  
recommend for the Governor's  
consideration the suggestions  
(1) that in all cases of  
convictions under sentences in-  
flicted by a Resident Mag-  
istrate sitting alone with  
another justice the sentences  
should expire at the end  
of 2 years; (2) that in  
all cases of sentences  
inflicted by one or more  
justices of the peace (sitting

without a Magistrate) the sen-  
-ences if cumulative should  
expire at the end of 12 months;  
if not cumulative, at the end  
of 6 months. It may appear  
superfluous to make the latter  
suggestion as 6 months is  
the maximum term that can  
legally be inflicted by an ordi-  
-nary justice under the existing  
law; but an examination of the  
list shows several convictions  
illegal in this respect.  
Thus nos 18 and 19 have been  
sentenced by 2 justices (neither  
of them being a Resident Mag-  
-istrate) to periods of 2 years  
for single offences. Again  
one justice has sentenced  
no 102 to one year, no 103 to  
3 years (1 year and 2 years  
cumulative) and no 180 to  
2 years. The case of no 143  
is noteworthy. In July 1882

he was sentenced by a justice  
to 7 years for "vandalis & robbery  
of sheep" no particulars being given.  
The same justice apparently sen-  
-tenced no 117 to a term of 8  
years, also for "vandalis & robbery"  
no particulars being there  
given. It seems to be very  
desirable that Magistrates and  
justices should carefully observe  
the provisions of Section 10 of the  
New Act which requires them  
to send full particulars to Perth  
of all their convictions

equivalent to those of a Resident Magistrate.

3 - I agreed to the Hon. Attorney General's  
proposal that convictions of a Resident Magi-  
strate were to carry a reduction of sentence to  
two years, but not lower. But Mr. Fops has <sup>been</sup> ~~been~~  
treated as a simple justice of the Peace.

and many sentences passed by him have been scheduled to be reduced as agreed in the case of justice's sentences, i.e., to six months, except when cumulative, and then to a year.

4 — As, of the 120 prisoners dealt with in the schedule, about 70 have been sentenced by Mr. Foss, the mistake is extensive, and it is fortunate I discovered it. As it is, I have liberated eight prisoners who should have served another year, or nearly a year, each.

5 — As to minor errors, these appear to have been made in the scheduling of the prisoners Nos. 60, 55, and probably others. No 103 does not appear to have been scheduled at all. Notice also Nos. 123, 124, 125, &c.

6 — I now request that this Schedule may be gone through very carefully, and corrected when necessary, by the Hon. Attorney General.

The tabular statement ~~was~~ sent to me in order that certain clerical details should be worked out, is one containing all the information that can be gathered from the various warrants of commitment. (See Mr Jackson's Minute of Jan 1. 1883)

Mr Foss's convictions up to a certain date are described as the convictions of a justice of the peace, after that date they are the convictions of a Resident Magistrate. The Act 46 Vic No 26 does not make the former convictions equivalent to those of a Resident Magistrate. It makes convictions by Mr Foss acting in the capacity of an itinerant stipendiary Magistrate of the same force effect and validity as if they had been made by a Resident Magistrate.

All the warrants previous to April 1883 are on their face warrants after convictions of Mr Foss acting as a justice of the peace and not as an itinerant stipendiary Magistrate. [This page not to be written upon.] or Resident Magistrate, and they have therefore been ~~correctly~~ treated

the  
as emittions of an ordinary justice  
of the peace, which is all they are  
in law.

As to the Minor errors referred to by  
His Excellency Nos 55, 60, 123, 124 and 125  
appear to have had a date appended  
to their names as the time of the ex-  
piration of their sentence, which was  
in each case, months too early. This has  
been rectified, and it will be seen  
that the ~~time~~ time as so extended  
had expired in every case before their  
list was sent to me.

~~Learned~~ As to the discharge  
of certain prisoners since these papers  
were sent to me, if they have been  
discharged in consequence of an ac-  
cidence with the suggestions made  
of me they have certainly not been  
improperly discharged. On the contrary  
if many of these emittions were  
to be legally tested it would be  
probably found that they were ab-  
solutely illegal, and that the  
prisoners ~~were~~ <sup>have been</sup> wrongfully detained.

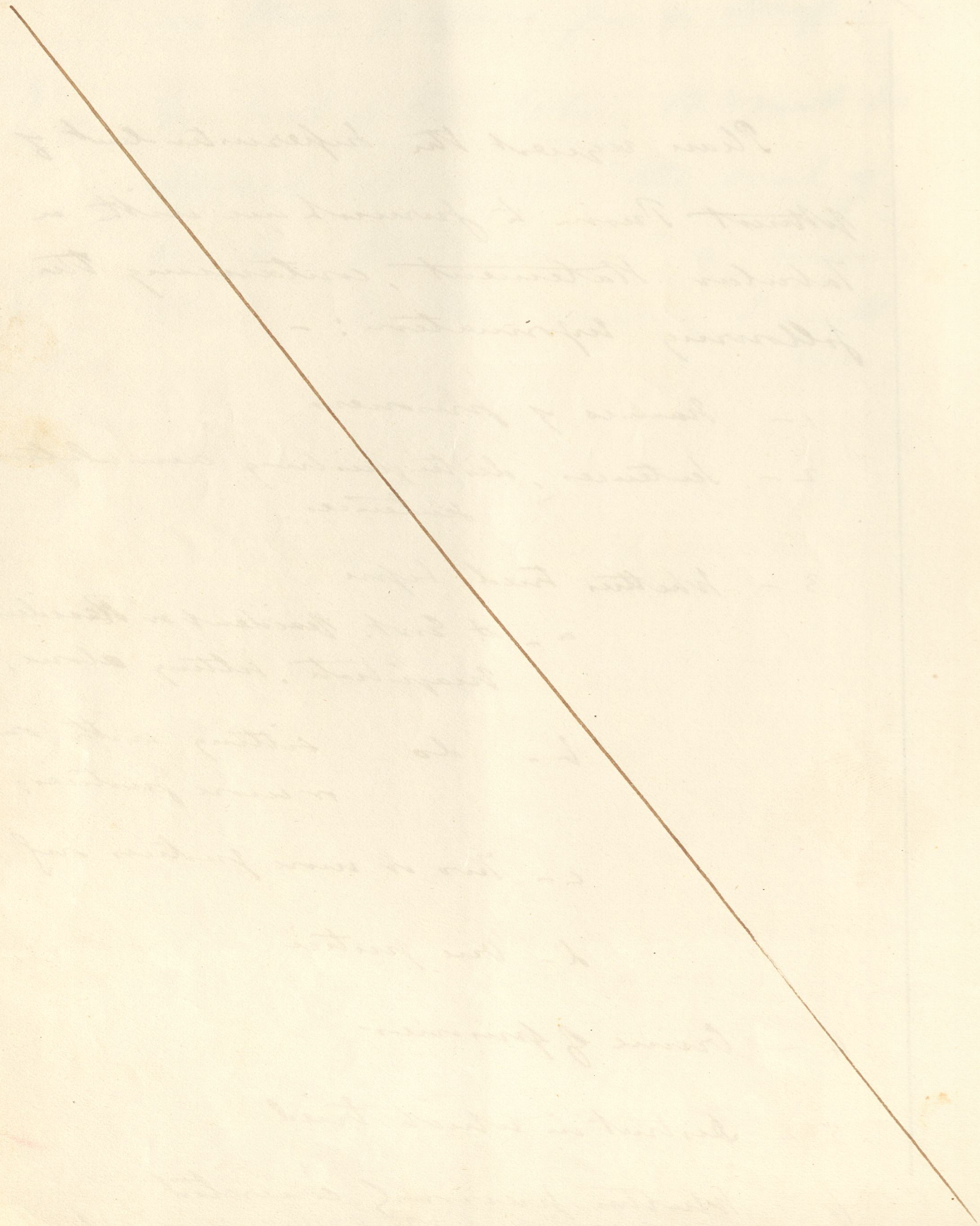
